Red represents the sacrifice and lives lost, and in particular, the red poppies are a symbol of remembrance. Discuss the concept of how and why poppies are a symbol of war.	 What do you know about war? What are the meanings and history behind ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day? 'We will remember them' and 'Lest we forget' What do these phrases mean and why is it important to never forget? Where is Kings Park? Research and locate Kings Park on a map. Write a short poem to express gratitude to fallen soldiers who sacrificed their lives for their country. 	Look at how the artist utilised a combination of mixed media, including acrylic paints and cut-out paper to create this piece. Create your own poppies using materials such as coloured paper, tissue paper, crepe paper, cupcake liners, painted paper plates, pipe cleaners, buttons, etc. Make a class mural with your own poppies and wildflowers attached to represent those who have fallen for us.
